The Onondaga County Community Development Office has previously requested information from the Town in order to assist the County in preparing a 5-Year Consolidated Plan, as required by the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). HUD makes these funds available for distribution by the County to towns and municipalities for local improvements. The funds are available for only those areas eligible under the criteria established by HUD. The Town must contribute approximately 25% of the total project funding, which can be in-kind services, fund-raising, formation of special districts, taxation, etc.

# These projects are generally based on the County's map of currently eligible areas in the Town.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Van Buren (the "Town Board" and the "Town", respectively), in the County of Onondaga, State of New York, received a Petition pursuant to Article 12 of the Town Law, for the establishment of the Van Buren Consolidated Water District, Extension No. 2 (the "Water District Extension") in an area generally known as Tax Map No.: 055.-02-04.0, Town of Van Buren, New York, which Petition is signed by the owner of the taxable real property situate in the proposed Water District Extension, owning in the aggregate at least one-half of the assessed valuation of all the taxable real property of the proposed Water District Extension, as shown upon the latest completed assessment roll of said Town, and including the signatures of resident owners of taxable real property owning taxable real property aggregating at least one-half of the assessed valuation of all the taxable real property of the proposed Water District Extension, owned by resident owners according to the latest completed assessment roll; and

WHEREAS, all costs in connection with the Water District Extension, including all legal and engineering expenses incurred by the Town, and all costs of construction of the water facilities necessary to serve said Water District Extension and also all costs and expenses incidental to the acquisition of necessary lands and rights-of-way therefore will be paid by the petitioner, its grantees, successors or assigns, who will subsequently execute, if necessary, an instrument conveying title to all or such portions of such water facilities including lands or rights-of-way that may be required by the Town Board of the Town of Van Buren, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances, to the said Water District Extension at no expense to said District as extended or the Town of Van Buren; and

WHEREAS, an order was duly adopted by the Town Board on March 3, 2021 for the hearing of all persons interested in the matter on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2021 at 7:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter could be heard, at the Town Hall in said Town and the hearing by the said Town Board having been duly held at such time and place, and proof of posting and publication of the notice of said hearing as required by law having been received by the Town Board, and the Town Board having heard all persons interested in such matter; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board has received a Map, Plan and Report prepared by William D. Morse, P.E. (W-M Engineering, DPC), certifying that the plans for construction of the improvements within the Water District Extension are satisfactory and meet the requirements of the Town, subject to inspection by the Town Engineer at petitioner's sole cost and expense upon installation of the facility extensions therein; and

WHEREAS, the permission of the State Comptroller shall not be required for the extension of said District nor the construction of said improvements since the Town shall not be required to finance the cost of said improvements by the issuance of bonds, notes, certificates, or other evidences of indebtedness of the Town; and

WHEREAS, on March 3, 2021, the Town Board also determined that the Water District Extension and construction of improvements therein will have no significant effects on the environment and that such determination constituted a negative declaration for purposes of environmental review.

#### NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AND DETERMINED, that:

A. The petition aforesaid is signed and acknowledged or proved as required by law, it duly complies with the requirements of Section 191 of the Town Law as to sufficiency of signers

with respect to the boundaries of the proposed district extension as herein approved and it is otherwise sufficient;

B. All the property and property owners within the proposed district extension are benefited thereby;

C. All the property and property owners benefited are included within the limits of the proposed district extension;

D. It is in the public interest to grant in whole the relief sought; and it is further

**RESOLVED AND DETERMINED**, that all future costs and expenses of operation, maintenance and improvements in said District, including those relative to the Water District Extension which is the subject of this resolution, shall be assessed, levied and collected from the several lots and parcels of land within the entire area of said Van Buren Consolidated Water District, Extension No. 2, in an area generally known as Tax Map No.: 055.-02-04.0, Town of Van Buren, New York, deemed benefited thereby in proportion to the amount of benefit conferred upon same; and it is further

**RESOLVED**, that the said Van Buren Consolidated Water District, Extension No. 2 be established and extended in said Town of Van Buren, Onondaga County, New York, to include the description and boundaries as set forth in Schedule "A", as hereinbefore described to be known as Van Buren Consolidated Water District, Extension No. 2, and it is further

**RESOLVED**, that the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause a certified copy of this Order to be recorded and filed in accordance with the provisions of Article 12 of the Town Law.

Discussion/Action on opening of playground programming/pool:

Mr. Sykes said it is best to discuss these one at a time.

Mr. Sykes said the Parks & Recreation Committee met to discuss issues surrounding the parks programming and pool under the current guidelines from the Onondaga County Health Department, which have not been updated since June of 2020. The County Health Department is

at the mercy of the State Health Dept. to determine if these guidelines will be updated. Currently they still require six feet of social distancing and that all touch surfaces be disinfected hourly.

Mrs. Van Der Water said these guidelines in particular make it financially impossible to open the pool this summer. She said they discussed allowing small groups in for a limited time period but between the cost to the patrons and increase in staff, supplies, etc. it has been determined it is not feasible this year.

<u>066-21-036</u> MOTION BY Ms. Dickman, seconded by Mr. Tupper, to not open Van Buren Central Park pool this summer due to restrictions caused by Covid-19.

Mr. Sykes said the playground program that has been run at Van Buren Central Park was discussed and that too would have a drastically reduced number of kids allowed under the current guidelines. The town could have seven at the lodge and about ten at the big pavilion. It is not fiscally possible to run the playground program with that small a number of children enrolled. He said if guidelines change we may be able to use the park but not at this time.

Mrs. Van Der Water said the recreation Supervisor will hold smaller weeklong camps for between seven and ten children that will be half day programs.

Mrs. Van Der Water said the Board is very aware this is a hardship on families but we have to follow the current guidelines.

Ms. Sabin noted that because these programs are recreational and not educational the town cannot follow the three foot guidelines in place at schools now.

Mrs. Van Der Water said the town was able to secure McNamara School as a site for a five week summer playground program for between 40 and 50 children adhering to the current six feet of social distancing. She said it will run from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm. Because the town will have to pay for the school district janitorial staff to disinfect the cost of this program will increase to \$350.00 per child.

Mrs. Van Der Water said pavilion rentals were also discussed. The current guidelines will require picnic tables to be nine feet apart, which in many cases mean they will not be able to fit under the pavilions. She said the town will allow for tents to be set up adjacent to the pavilion for overhead cover. The pavilion rental application will include the same waiver that is used by Onondaga County Park's Department. She said town staff will disinfect the pavilions after use but it is up to the person renting the pavilion to distribute masks, hand sanitizer and ensure their guests are practicing social distancing.

The bathhouse will be open and disinfected according to the Onondaga County Health Department guidelines. A porta john will be available on the pond side of the park.

Mr. Sykes said he attended a meeting today with Matt Driscoll, NYS Thruway Director, Assemblyman Magnarelli and County Legislator Ken Bush to discuss the Canton Street Bridge. He said Mr. Driscoll handed out a report on the bridge and its replacement and that information is on the homepage of our website. Mr. Sykes said they have 137 bridges in similar condition and this is a resource issue. They cannot fix them all. He said Assemblyman Magnarelli said if the bridge is not replaced Van Buren is getting short changed. Mr. Driscoll said he will try to find a way but made no promises.
