<u>Introduction of Local Law F-2018 amending Chapter 200 of Town Code titled "zoning" to remove motorized vehicle racing as an allowed use:</u>

<u>217-18-030</u> Mr. Dudzinski introduced proposed Local Law No. F-2018, amending Chapter 200 of the Code of the Town of Van Buren titled "Zoning" to Remove Motorized Vehicle Racing as an Allowed Use, which was seconded by Mr. Tupper:

WHEREAS, the Town Board has considered the adoption of said Local Law, has considered the criteria contained in 6 N.Y.C.R.R. Part 617.7 and has compared the impacts which may be reasonably expected to result from the adoption of said Local Law against said criteria;

WHEREAS, an EAF in support of this local law has been prepared and has been reviewed by the Town Board; and

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED, that no other agency has the legal authority or jurisdiction to approve or directly undertake the enactment of a local law in the Town of Van Buren, such that there are no other involved agencies within the meaning of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQR) with respect to the proposed enactment of said Local Law, with the result that the Town Board shall act as lead agency in this matter; and it is further

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED, that the enactment of said Local Law is a Type I action for purposes of environmental review under SEQR; and it is further

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED, the Town Board upon review of the plan, EAF and project it has determined this action will have no adverse impact on the environment; that accordingly, an environmental impact statement (EIS) shall not be required; and that this resolution shall constitute a negative declaration under SEQRA based upon the following Reasons and Findings:

- The Board hereby finds and determines that due to high <u>noise</u> levels, and other potential impacts from odors, lights and traffic there is <u>no</u> appropriate location within the Town for such uses.
- Such uses can draw significant crowds and traffic, disruption in local vicinity.
- Removal of potential use will result in no adverse environmental impact, in fact will most likely have a positive impact.
- There will be no adverse impacts on land, surface water, ground water, drainage, geological features, air, plants or animals, agricultural resources, aesthetic resources, historic/archeological resources, open space, critical environmental areas, transportation, energy, noise, odors, lights, human health, community plans, community character or flooding.

RESOLVED, that the Town Board shall conduct a public hearing as to the enactment of proposed Local Law No. F-2018 at the Town Hall located at 7575 Van Buren Road in the Town on December 4, 2018 at 7:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, at which time all persons interested in the subject shall be heard.
